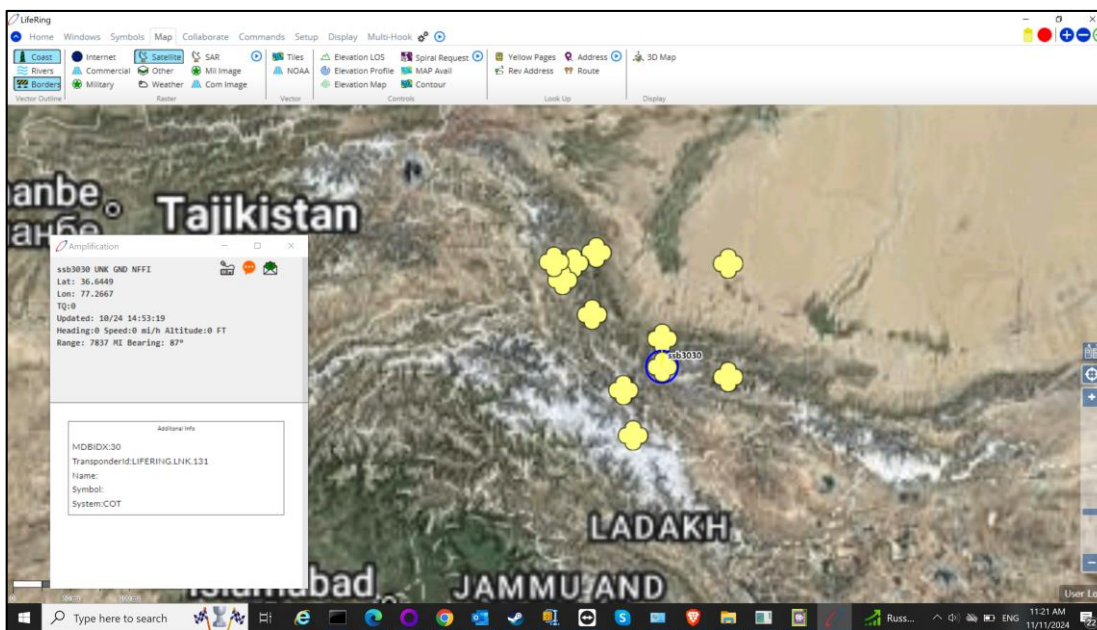


## AGIS adds ADatP-36 to its CADC2 C5ISR System Enabling full NATO Interoperability

A First - AGIS' Low-cost Joint All-Domain Command and Control (JADC2) system has been updated to Interface US Air, Ground and Sea forces with NATO forces using NATO's ADatP-36 data link. This will enable US NATO interoperability allowing US and NATO forces to have a multinational Common Operational Picture (COP) between all. With this integration, more cohesive operations can occur lessening the chance of fratricide while simultaneously increasing operational effectiveness. This will facilitate presentation of complex, multi-domain operational data with high fidelity, ensuring that all CJADC2 participants—regardless of their nation or branch—share the COP.

AGIS addition of ADatP-36 along with Link-16, JVMF, OTH Gold, CoT and NATO NVG, ADEM provides accurate and consistent data fusion from multiple domains (land, sea, air, cyber, and space), critical for CJADC2. Operators from different branches and coalition forces can see unified symbols representations of assets and threats, facilitating synchronized responses allowing commanders to make quicker, more informed decisions based on precise location, role, and status information for each element on the battlefield. See the below ADatP-36 data displayed on a georeferenced satellite image as a test at a nonrepresentative location.



Use of US MIL-STD-2525 / NATO APP-6A symbology across the CJADC2 network ensures that all parties interpret situational information the same way. This reduces confusion and communication friction, particularly in high-stakes, rapidly changing operational environments.
